

# FEDERAL CUTS

## *What Do We Really Know?*

### 10K staff eliminated

10,000 staff eliminated at the federal Department of Health & Human Services, which provides money to NYS via various grants and is traditionally a vanguard when it comes to public health and vaccinations

### \$40M in cuts for OASAS

OASAS is anticipating a \$40 million reduction in federal funding, which will significantly affect fentanyl and other addiction treatment services throughout the state.

### NIH freeze impacts SUNY, DOH & HRI

NIH freeze chills NYS health research / Federal grants are frozen, impacting the funding available for life-saving work at SUNY Hospitals, the Dept. of Health, and Health Resources International, which may cut 150 staff in NYS.

### \$5.5B NIH budget cuts announced

\$5.5 billion worth of cuts to the National Institutes of Health

## *Other Programs Could be Subject to Federal Reductions*

Department of Labor	\$600 million	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>\$230 million to administer unemployment insurance</li> <li>\$200 million Workforce Investment Opportunity Act</li> </ul>
Department of Transportation	\$5.3 billion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>\$1.1 billion National Highway Performance Program</li> <li>\$1.2 billion in State of Good Repair grants</li> </ul>

## *In addition, cuts have severely impacted these federal programs that impact New Yorkers.*

### Oversight and Government Reform:

\$50 billion cut from their budget



### Social Security:

- 7,000 staff laid off
- \$800 million worth of administrative expenses canceled
- Identity verification by phone is no longer possible
- Any cuts to Social Security taxes will shorten lifespan of the troubled Trust Fund



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
